

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

### Disinfection and Disinfection Byproducts Monitoring Requirements Not Met for City of Woodlake During the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter of 2019

Our water system failed to monitor as required for drinking water standards during the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter 2019 and, therefore, was in violation of the regulations. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we did to correct this situation.

#### What happened?

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter 2019, we did not monitor for Total Trihalomethanes (TTHMs) and Haloacetic Acids (HAA5s) and therefore, cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

#### What should I do?

- There is nothing you need to do at this time.
- The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did not properly test for during the last year, how many samples we are required to take and how often, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples were (or will be) taken.

## **What happened? What is being done?**

A sample was inadvertently sent later than required. The City shall collect TTHM and HHA5 samples between June 1 and September 30, 2020 from the approved Disinfection Byproduct site, and the laboratory, which conducts the analysis, will submit the analytical results to the State Water Board electronically by a State Water Board approved method no later than the 10<sup>th</sup> day of the month following completion of the analyses.

## **Secondary Notification Requirements**

Upon receipt of notification from a person operating a public water system, the following notification must be given within 10 days [Health and Safety Code Section 116450(g)]:

- **SCHOOLS:** Must notify school employees, students, and parents (if the students are minors).
- **RESIDENTIAL RENTAL PROPERTY OWNERS OR MANAGERS** (including nursing homes and care facilities): Must notify tenants.
- **BUSINESS PROPERTY OWNERS, MANAGERS, OR OPERATORS:** Must notify employees of businesses located on the property.

This notice is being sent to you by the City of Woodlake in compliance with the California Domestic Water Quality and Monitoring Regulations as a means of keeping the public informed.

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
